tions during protests and equip themselves for physical combat. To ensure the safety and security of the general public
and those who seek to exercise their right to peacefully assemble and protest, effective immediately, certain items may be prohibited from the capitol grounds unless worn or carried by a Open-flame torche gas masks, helmets, pepper spray and shields were included on a list of more than 20 prohibited items provided by DPS.
Furthermore, the DPS said, while citizens have a right to counter-protest within the capitol complex, "they must do so at a distance sufficient to avoid physical alterca-
tions." By statute, the DPS has the authority and primary responsibility for law enforcement and security services over the complex and grounds.
