Crosby ISD calls for special audit

CROSBY – A special meeting of the Crosby ISD Board of Trustees was called last Monday night to consider authorizing the expense of up to \$20,000 for an objective, third party audit of district expenses and internal controls.

The CISD Operations Center was less packed than a previous board meeting where everyone learned that there was over \$345,000 in a deficit before anything is bought for the 2018-2019 school year. Everyone also learned that the district was trying to see what supplies could be held to a minimum before laying off personnel could begin to be determined. We learned that the district is at 89% of the total expenses for personnel where it should

be at 80% for personnel. That in 2016-2017 100 new positions were filled and in 2017-2018 forty new positions were filled. Speculation is that about 117 positions are currently at risk from lack of funding.

Scott Davis Superintendent for Crosby ISD recommended approval of an initial financial and controls analysis for no more than \$20,000 to give a clue to any criminal mismanagement or faulty processes that might have allowed the shortfall of funding. It would give the board the option to look further into deeper investigation with the legally actionable forensic audit but at less than six figures of funding that is not available without extra cuts.

J.R. Humphries, a board

member elect, spoke before the meeting also calling for a \$20,000 audit first but calling that a forensic audit.

Celina Miller and Lupe Garcia are prospective auditors with Whitley Penn LLP. The described divergent audit services than those performed by Weaver and Tidwell, LLP. The latter being the auditors preparing 2017-2018 general audit. The general audit looks at the factuality of financial statements, not opining the financial health of the district. Whitney Penn LLP would then give a better understanding of trends and would find any fraud or misrep-

Constable Sherman Eagleton outside the board meeting explained about hiring of extra security personnel on contract from his or any other department, with help from his Chief Clerk. According to the Constable, while the school district is being charged \$90,000 for the new personnel, at about \$40,000 in salary it is costing his department about \$100,000 for that person to be hired.

Eagleton also shared his efforts for extra safety at the schools in his Precinct and that other districts had doubled their hiring of security personnel after the Santa Fe shooting. He explained that Crosby ISD cannot afford to do extra security at this time.

Rehab unit helps former coach get Back into the Game

BAYTOWN — (September 21, 2018) — As a former high school football coach, Milton Kellner knows all about what it takes to get the most out of his athletes. The Baytown resident is now relying on those same skills as he recovers from a recent surgery.

Kellner, 75, served as football coach at Baytown's Robert E. Lee High School from 1969 through 1985, while his wife of 51 years, Laura, enjoyed a lengthy career as an algebra teacher at Baytown's Ross S. Sterling High School. Both retired from education in 2002.

Following a surgical procedure on his back, Kellner was admitted into the Houston Methodist San Jacinto Hospital Rehabilitation Unit to undergo physical and occupational therapy.

"I was a patient there two years ago following a surgery on my leg and I really thought it was a great place," Kellner said. "I wanted to go back there this time because whether it's physical or occupational therapy, they do a great job of pushing you to the limit."

Located at the Baytown hospital's Alexander campus (1700 James Bowie Dr.), the rehabilitation unit is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) and is also certified as a primary stroke center. The care team provides in-patient and outpatient treatment for patients dealing with a variety of conditions, including neurological disorders such as multiple sclerosis and Parkinson's disease; arthritis; the effects of stroke; major multiple trauma and those who have undergone surgeries, including joint replacement.

Kellner says his daily, three-hour therapy sessions were demanding, but enjoyable because he could tell he was progressing.

"All of the therapists were very knowledgeable about what muscles you need to work on and immediately had me doing exercises to activate those muscles," Kellner said. "They push you, but do it gently so you don't do too much. They gave me exercises to do at home and I'm definitely feeling better than when I got there."

Physical therapist Ben Vasquez said Kellner was determined to return to his active lifestyle.

"We worked on strengthening, transfer and gait retraining, including neuromuscular re-education, such as standing balance and coordination exercises," Vasquez said. "We also addressed his impaired posture and tight-

ness in his hamstring muscles." Occupational therapist Fei Wu worked with Kellner on performing everyday tasks such as eating, cooking, grooming and walking to prepare him for returning home.

"My treatments for Mr. Kellner were individualized. For example, he uses the bathtub at home in-

stead of a walk-in shower, so I let him walk with a rolling walker to the bathroom to practice transferring from the tub bench to the bathtub," Wu said. "He cooks simple meals at home, so I incorporated meal preparation into his program. He made great progress and was able to perform self-care tasks mostly by himself when he was discharged."

Physical therapist Erin Beam said Kellner's background in athletics was beneficial in his recovery. "He was always ready to work and pushed himself to be better every day, so it was unsurprising to learn that he is a retired high school football coach," Beam said.

For Kellner and Laura, who raised two kids and have five grandchildren, being able to receive such unparalleled treatment in their hometown, was a godsend.

"It was very convenient for me. I felt like I was on familiar ground. When I had visitors, it was easy for them to come here," Kellner said.

Cruz & Beto hold first debate for U.S. Senate seat

DALLAS – Last Friday night, the candidates for the U. S. Senate from Texas held a televised debate, and each delivered a feisty and factual speech.

Senator Ted Cruz is the incumbent, seeking this second term as a Senator from Texas. Beto O'Rourke is a Congressman from El Paso, and wants to replace Cruz as Senator. Cruz is the Republican candidate, and Beto the Democratic challenger.

The campaign for this seat has drawn national attention, because this is one race where the Republicans might lose a seat, and possibly the majority vote in the Senate. Polls over the last few weeks have shown Cruz leading by several points, but Beto notes that each poll has shown his followers increasing their position.

Beto has attempted to draw support from a popular base, by visiting all 254 counties in the state, on a driving tour. He has appeared locally at a number of events, including a Town Hall in Channelview, and a Rally at the Stampede Club in Aldine where a huge crowd yelled their support.

Friday's debate had an audience, and at times they applauded one or the other candidates. It was hard to tell which had the most support, but Beto seemed to have the loudest.

Both candidates were extremely good debaters, and as the intensity grew, they sometimes attacked the other.

Candidates mostly spoke on domestic issues, and their will be a two later debates on a broader agenda.

They disagreed on immigration policy, freedom of speech as witnessed by the NFL players kneeling, second amendment



gun rights, marijuana legalization, police-involved shootings, and the hearings for Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh.

On immigration, Beto said he wanted a way to legalize undocumented immigrants, and opposed Cruz's position of deporting them, including "Dreamers." Cruz's response was "Legal Good, Illegal Bad," which drew a negative reaction from the audience.

In several ways, Cruz tried to portray Beto as anti-law enforcement, citing events that Beto has commented on. Beto charged that Cruz was changing the facts, and slandering him.

On Kavanaugh's appointment, Cruz said that Beto showed a pattern of supporting liberal activist judges that will

not follow the Constitution.

Beto said that Cruz was a part-time Senator, missing one-quarter of the votes in 2015, and one-half of the votes in 2016. Cruz countered by saying he has been in the field during every disaster or shooting in Texas.

On school shootings, Cruz said that we have "removed God" but Beto said that he supports the second amendment gun rights, with opposed making military-style guns available to the public.

Future of TRS health care hinges on lawmakers' support

AUSTIN — Retired teachers facing the unwelcome prospect of paying higher monthly health insurance premiums received better-than-expected news last week.

The Teachers Retirement System board of trustees on Sept. 21 voted not to increase premiums because the TRS staff negotiated a better rate and other cost savings with its health insurance provider, while keeping plan and pharmacy benefits the same.

The TRS Care fund balance had been projected to be \$410 million in the red at the end of 2021. To address the shortfall, the Texas Legislature in 2017 directed TRS to increase premiums by \$50 per year over the next four years.

But TRS's successful negotiations improved the projected fund balance to minus \$238 million, an amount the Legislature can include in the appropriations process during its 2019 session, which begins in January. Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick said he is "confident that the Senate will support additional funding for TRS Care" and "hopeful the next speaker of the House will follow our lead on this."

AG's office cautions AISD

The Texas Attorney General's office on Sept. 21 cautioned Austin Independent School District "against changing its facilities use policy to ban churches with traditional Christian beliefs from renting its facilities after school and on weekends."

A letter from the attorney general's office warned the school district that the proposed actions are not neutral toward religion and violate the First Amendment and Texas' Religious Freedom Restoration Act.

"We caution you to reconsider these changes and be respectful of the religious liberty protections afforded churches under the Constitution and Texas law," stated the letter addressed to AISD Superintendent Paul Cruz and signed by First Assistant Attorney General Jeff Mateer.

In an Aug. 25 AISD web post, Cruz said, "The use of district properties by outside organizations does not create an endorsement of, or an association of that organization with the district. In addition, funds collected from the Performing Arts Center rental will be dedicated to our district-wide efforts to ensure we support an inclusive, welcoming environment for all students and staff including our LGBTQ students and staff," Cruz added.

Current Austin ISD policy expressly permits churches to rent school facilities on the same terms as all community organizations.

The AG's office said members of the district's board of trustees are on

record saying they're against renting AISD's performing arts center to an area church because of its stance that marriage is between a man and a woman.

Opponents meet in debate

Incumbent U.S. Sen. Ted Cruz on Sept. 21 met U.S. Rep. Beto O'Rourke in the first of three scheduled debates in the weeks leading up to the Nov. 6 midterm election.

O'Rourke, D-El Paso, is seeking to unseat Cruz, R-Texas, who is running for a second six-year term. The two faced off in a televised, 60-minute debate at Southern Methodist University in Dallas co-moderated by Gromer Jeffers of The Dallas Morning News and Julie Fine of the NBC-TV Dallas affiliate.

Cruz challenged O'Rourke on his personal life and attempted to characterize the Democrat as tax-friendly and pro-regulation. O'Rourke brought up Cruz's record of missing Senate floor votes while campaigning for the presidency in other states and not welcoming well-intentioned immigrants with a path to citizenship.

The two candidates have agreed to debate again on Sept. 30 in Houston and on Oct. 16 in San Antonio.

Flores wins runoff election

Republican Peter P. "Pete" Flores of Pleasanton won a Sept. 18 special runoff election for the Texas Senate District 19 seat.

The resignation of state Sen. Carlos Uresti after he was convicted of felony charges in June created the vacant Senate seat. In July, eight candidates vied in a special election to fill the post. Since no candidate received 50 percent of the vote, a runoff resulted between the top two in the field of eight: Flores and Democrat Pete Gallego of Alpine.

Returns posted by the Texas Secretary of State's Elections Division showed Flores received 23,576 votes, or 57 percent of the total number of votes cast in the runoff election, while Gallego received 20,911 votes, or 43 percent.

Flores retired as a game warden for the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department at the rank of colonel in 2012. Gallego, an attorney, served 11 consecutive terms as the representative for state House District 74, from 1991 to 2012, and one term as a U.S. representative for Texas Congressional District 23, serving from 2013 to 2015.

Sprawling SD-19 consists of Brewster, Crockett, Dimmit, Edwards, Frio, Kinney, Maverick, Medina, Pecos, Real, Reeves, Terrell, Uvalde, Val Verde and Zavala counties and parts of Atascosa and Bexar counties. An estimated 840,000 people reside in the district, an estimated 478,000 of whom a

resentation of the facts. This audit would look at board policies and the disposition of internal controls. This audit would be an "iterative process with the board but notable findings would be shared with the Board in open session," and the auditors would not "run to the D.A.'s office" before consulting the board.

John Swinney, At Large District representative and Board Vice President moved that any "wrongdoing found be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law, otherwise why spend the \$20,000."

Typically, actions of a legal consequence are not taken against school administrative except in extraordinary cases where funds or supplies have come up missing, the auditors had explained.
