## Mosquito Control in Chambers County

## By Lawrence Lewis Chambers County

 Control Director I am sure you have noticed over the last month that wehave a lot of mosquitoes. We have ataken many phone calls
havd online spray requess and online spray requests in
that time. The following arthat time. The following ar-
ticle should answer most of
the questions people have the questions people have
asked, and some they have not asked, regarding mosqui-
toes and what Chamber toes and what Chamber
County is doing about them.
First I would like to g over the life cycle of mosquitoes.
There
larva, pu larva, pupa, and adult.
The egos stag a The eggs stage is spent on
water or where water water or where water will be.
The larval and pupal stages The larval and pupal stages
are spent in water. The adult are spent in water. The adult
stage is spent in the air, feeding and laying eggs. It takes $7-10$ days to complete this life
cycle once the eegr is expose cycle once the egg is exposed
to water. It is important to note that there is not just "a" mosquito. There are over 150
different species in the U.S different species in the U.S.,
and over 60 of those species are present in Chambers
County. Different species County. Different species
have different traits. Species can be placed into Floodwater species lay their eggs singly in moist sool
or in open containers just or in open containers just
above the water-line. Permanent water species lay their eggs singly or in rafts (some
contain hundreds of eggs ) dicontain hundreds of eggs) di-
rectly on the surface of the
wate water. Some species lay their eggs in and around homes
and usually do not leave and usually do not leave a
square-mile area. Other species lay their eggs in areas
like like open pastureland and flight-rang of $50+$ miles. For
instance, the Aedes Sollici instance, the Aedes Sollici-
tans (salt marsh mosquito) will lay its eggs in moist soil in a salt marsh. When there is unusual tidal activity or
heavy rains the eggs will be flushed with water and the
mosquito begin their development. When they hatch into adults they will fly $50+$ miles
to feed. So even if you do not live near a salt marsh you can still have salt marsh mosquitoes. Another example is the
Culex Quinquefasciatus (southern house mosquito), a known vector to carry arbo-
virus infections such as West virus infections such as West
Nile Virus. They are Nitealthy biters. That are are active during the evening, night hours. They prefer polluted
water for breeding and will water for breeding and will
breed in containers. They lay their eggs inside and around the home. These mosquitoes do not fly yery far from where
they hatch into adults. One last example is the Aedes Albopictus (Asian Tiger Mosquito), a known vector to carry
the Zika virus. Its life cycle is close virus. Its life cyman habitats and it breeds in artificial containers with standing water,
often in tires, rain gutters, often in tires, rain gutters,
bird baths, plant pots \& horse troughs. It is recommended to dispose of old tires and containers that hold water.
Change it out every 3 days. Change it out every 3 days.
Ok, now that you know a little about mosquitoes, what can be done about them?
There are three There are three control
measures for mosquitoes. measures for mosquitoes
The first is source reduction. Source reduction is simply taking away potential "breed-
ing sites" (breeding sites ar ing sites" (breeding sites are
areas that hold or could hold water). Larviciding is next. Larviciding is the addi-
tion of larvicides (chemical tion of larvicides (chemical or
biological) to breeding sites. biological) to breeding sites.
Adulticiding is the last control measure. Adulticiding is the application of pesticides
over large areas to attack the over large areas
adult mosquito.
So, what does Chambers
County do about County do about mosquitoes? Our source reduction pro-
gram consists of inspecting gram consists of inspecting
homes when requested by cit-
izens. In our inspections, we
identify adult mosquitoes, identify adult mosquitoes,
which tells us where they are coming from. We then inspect
around the home to identify breeding sites and advise the homeowner of what was ound. It is then up to the problem identified or to not fix the problem.
Larvicide nore mosquiten control many ecause the density of larvae very high in water, as op-
posed to the number of adults In the air being less dense.
Larviciding is very time Larviciding is very time-con-
suming and, depending on how much water you have, very expensive. There are thousands of acres of tidal alone in Chambers County. here are thousands more in well.
Larvic Larviciding also is very
ime-restricted. Applications must be applied at the right fective. in the life cycle to be efAdulticiding is the highapply. We apply adulticides
with 10 truck-mounted units and one airplane. We use our ruck-mounted units for small large areas our airplane for we use these applications oanly when there is a need. We deermine that need through
urveillance of larval and adult populations throughout the county. There are times when the
entire county is inundated with mosquitoes. During hese times, we treat as much
of the county as we can, as many times as we can until he populations of mosquitoes are reduced. Because of label
restrictions, there are times sestrictions, there are times
when we cannot make these applications. Labels are the instructions for pesticides
that tell us where, when and hat tell us where, when, and Some of these restrictions are: pesticides does not leave a residual. That means the pes-
icide has to actually hit the mosquito in the air to kill it. 2) When the sun comes up
it produces thermals, which are rising currents of air The pesticides will essentially
evaporate before they can be effective. Also, more species are active at night.
3) The wind 10 mph or less to make an application. Large-scale adulticiding needs some drift to be
effective. Any application by air or ground in wind speeds of more than 10 mph will not be effective. As for the question of
which is more effective, the truck or the airplane, they are both effective. Aerial applications cover much more area
and are less expensive on a per acre basis than truckmounted units. Truck-mounted units cover much smaller areas but can reach under
heavy vegetation better than aerial applications.
There are several things you can do as a homeowner to
reduce mosquito populations round your home. Throw
away any container that can hold water, such as bottles,
cans, tires, jugs, and cups If cans, tires, jugs, and cups. If
you like to collect rainwater, over your container with a ters clean. Fill in low-lying areas around your home.
Clean birdbaths weekly.
Empty your pet's water bowl Empty your pet's water bowl
weekly. Do not let water collect in. the not let water of clowerpots whether they are inside
or outside the house. Put goldfish or minnows in decorative ponds and livestock water troughs.
