Harris County Small Business Relief Crosby sends relief Fund now open for applications

COVID relief grants from \$5,000 to \$25,000 available until October 4

Harris County Judge Lina Hidalgo and Pct. 1 Commissioner Rodney Ellis held a new conference last Monday afternoon, September 20 to announce the start of the Harris County Small Business Relief Fund Application period. The application window will remain open until Monday, October 4 at 5:30 p.m.

On August 10, Harris County approved the \$30 million relief fund to support small and micro businesses recovering from the effects of the pandemic. The Small Business Relief Fund was created with funding from the American

Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and is being administered by LiftFund, a nonprofit organization that supports small business owners with funding and business education.

Harris County urges by visiting the website at www.harriscountybusinessrelief.org to review the applicant checklist to verify eligibility for this program and also to be prepared with the proper documentation needed to apply before the application portal opens.

--Registered as a business operating in Harris County

Focus on Weight Management Surgery

ber 16, 2021) — While obesity is linked to the development of a variety of serious medical conditions many candidates for the procedure are hesitant to come forward due to social stigmas often attached to being overweight.

Whether due to embarrassment, uncertainty about what the surgical procedure entails or hesitancy in deciding to make a big lifestyle change, many people struggling with obesity choose to suffer in silence rather than reach out to learn more about it. Houston Methodist Baytown Hospital bariatric surgeon Dr. Kendall Sowards says delaying seeking help can lead to serious conditions such as type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, stroke and heart disease.

Sowards presents a discreet way to learn more about bariatric surgery when she hosts a live online weight loss surgery orientation from noon to 1 p.m. on Tuesday, September 21. Participants will

 $BAYTOWN - (Septem- \ \ \, have \ the \ opportunity \ to$ meet with Sowards virtually and learn about the types of bariatric procedures offered. You will also gain an understanding of what happens before, during and after surgery, get to ask questions and hear from others considering weight loss surgery.

"Weight loss surgery helps patients reduce their calorie intake, but the procedures are combined with counseling and dietary education to help patients learn about their own eating habits and stay fit after they lose weight,' Sowards said.

Bariatric surgery treats obesity-defined as a Body Mass Index (BMI) of 30 or above-by restricting the amount of food you can eat and/or changes the route food takes through your body, resulting in less food being absorbed.

Patients whose BMI is 40 and above are eligible for bariatric surgery, while those whose BMI is in the 35-40 range are also eligible if they have existing medical conditions consid-

sociated with obesity

The Houston Methodist Center for Weight Loss & Bariatric Surgery at Baytown offers personalized care through medical nutritional counseling and bariatric (weight loss) surgery for patients affected by conditions attributed to obesity.

The most commonly performed weight loss surgery procedures are the sleeve gastrectomy, which re-shapes the stomach into a thin, sleeve-shaped organ that helps to limit the amount of food that can be consumed at a given time, and the Roux-en-Y gastric bypass. With this surgery,

part of the stomach is stapled off, leaving a small ouch that will only hold a few ounces of food. The digestive tract is redirected to bypass the upper small intestine, which reduces total calories absorbed.

"The center offers comprehensive nutritional and counseling after-care programs to help our patients adjust to the physical and emotional changes that frequently occur after surgerv." Sowards said. "It is essential that patients be willing to make major lifestyle and dietary changes in order to achieve optimal results following any bariatric surgery procedure."


