# 100°+ Heat Wave setting records

HARRIS COUNTY -For at least 18 days since the beginning of the year, Southeast Texas has experienced record setting temperatures of 100°+. In the month of July, we are on track to set the hottest month on record, checking records all the way back to 1889. Little to no rain is forecast to alleviate this problem for the next week or more.

Authorities are advising about Heat Stroke, and other measures to deal with the excessive heat.

Heat Safety & Heat Stroke: What You Need to Know During a Heat Wave

When you live in Southeast Texas where the summers are always hot, a heat warning or advisory may not seem like a big deal. But, right now, it's excessively hot, and it's a good time to brush up on heat safety.

Heat stroke, also re-



ferred to as sun stroke, is when a person's body overheats as a result of exposure to hot weather. When it's particularly hot outside, your body temperature can rise faster than your body's cooling mechanisms (such as sweating) are able to lower it. In addition, heat that's accompanied by high humidity

(above 75%) can reduce the effect sweat has on lowering your body temperature.

"In most cases, heat stroke results from exercising outside in the heat without proper hydration. But, when it's really hot outside, a person doesn't have to be exercising to develop heat stroke," said

Dr. Gregory Terry, a primary care physician with Houston Methodist Baytown.

Here's what you need to know about heat stroke and staying safe in the heat during a heat wave.

The signs and symptoms of heat stroke:

The most common symptoms of heat stroke include:

—A body temperature of 104 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, as measured by a rectal thermometer

-Sudden confusion or hallucinations

-Difficulty walking

—Seizures

-Fainting

"People suffering from heat stroke may also experience racing heart rate, rapid breathing, overly warm skin or skin redness, vomiting or diarrhea, muscle cramps and weakness, and throbbing headaches," said Dr. Terry.

Heat stroke is an emergency requiring immediate medical attention

The high body temperature associated with heat stroke can damage your brain, heart, kidneys, muscles and other organs. "The

## **Galena Park ISD trains for School Safety**

# Preparation to deal with an Active Shooter

GALENA PARK – In the aftermath of the terrible murders at a school in Uvalde, parents and students have been concerned about safety and security as they prepare to return to schools in August.

In the Galena Park school district, school safety is a top priority, with the district police department trained and equiped to handle emergencies such as active shooters.

In an interview with this newspaper, GPISD police chief Bryan Clements outlined the safety measures enacted through all the schools. In addition, the yearly simulation drill was broadcast live on local television station KPRC channel 2, with an interview with Cathy Hernandez, a Galena Park graduate.

Clements said that for a number of years, armed officers have been assigned to each middle and high school, and that this year the GPISD trustees have increased the number of police officers from 21 to 40, with the hiring of an additional 19 positions. This number provides an officer for each school, from K through high school.

Clements said that all

the officers are put through rigorous training, and once a year have an 8hour class session and drill regarding how to suppress an active shooter.

Safety and security routines are also part of each

schools daily routine, Clements said. Officers and school staff are instructed that all outside doors must be locked, and classroom doors also locked during class. Officers are instructed to check each door throughout the day for compliance.

Schools are also equiped for this type of active shooter emergency, with a ballistic shield and medical equipment stocked and available at every school.

The Safety Drill was available to see on television, Clements said, because it is important for families to see that students will be protected when they come to school.

As part of the active shooter training, officers found injured victimes in a hallway of the North Shore 10th Grade Center. The officers went straight to a classroom where two pretend shooters were with

students. The police chief said they had three priorities: stop the killing, stop the dying, and evacuate the injured.

Clements said the simulation training gives the officers a unique learning experience in stressful situations. He said he wants his officers to know what to do if a situation arises such as a shooter.

The training was open to the public to see, in person and on television. Participating were local fire and EMS personnel, and law enforcement agencies including Constables from Pct. 2 and 3.

Galena Park Superintendent Dr. John Moore had this to say about the training: "Students come to our schools to learn, but parents expect us to keep them safe. And that's our number one priority here in Galena Park, and I'm sure that's the number one priority all over the United States."

The first day of school will be August 11, and it can be expected to be a safe and secure opening.

longer heat stroke is left untreated, the more damage can be done to these vital organs — increasing the risk of long-term complications and even death," added Dr. Terry.

This means heat stroke is a medical emergency. If you or someone you love is showing signs of heat stroke, call 911 immediately.

While waiting for help to arrive, try to cool the person down by:

—Moving him or her into the shade or air conditioning

—Removing clothing

—Applying wet towels to the head, neck, armpits and groin or soaking in a cool bath

## <u>Heat stroke is preventable</u>

First of all, a person's risk of experiencing heat stroke is predictable. As soon as your local officials

issue a heat alert, especially if it's a heat advisory, that's your cue to take extra precautions to stay safe outdoors.

Given the serious nature of heat stroke, it's important to take steps to prevent heat stroke from happening altogether.

Tips for preventing heat stroke:

—Stay hydrated

—Avoid being in a parked car

—Wear loose-fitting clothing outdoors

—Exercise indoors or early in the morning

—Take frequent "cool down" breaks in the shade if you work outdoors

—Apply (and reapply) sunscreen

—Limit alcohol while in the heat

—Swap outdoor activities for indoor ones

## A Focused Future: Lee College Rebrands Mascot to "Navigators"

Board of Regents Voted for Change, Effective Immediately

BAYTOWN, July 21, 2022 – The Lee College Board of Regents voted unanimously to rebrand the college mascot to the Lee College Navigators. The change is effective immediately with the board vote and will be implemented during the 2022-23 academic year.

"As we seek to grow the college's enrollment and enlarge the offerings we provide to our rapidly growing and diverse service area, it is important to recognize the leadership our Board of Regents demonstrated in repositioning our brand for the future," said Dr. Lynda Villanueva, president. "The Lee College Navigators represent all the best attributes of our college and our students: future-facing, on a mission, capable and competent. I could not be more pleased with this decision, and I'm thrilled for the ex-



citing next steps."

In March 2021, the Board asked President Villanueva to develop a proposal on whether a change of the Lee College mascot was needed. The college determined that any recommendation to change the mascot should be based first on research to ascertain the brand attributes that best position Lee College for the near-and farterm futures, and then an assessment of how well the mascot represented those attributes.

Two large studies of the Lee College brand were conducted. The deliberate process included a quantitative survey that yielded nearly 450 responses in the college service area, and a qualitative survey that involved 30-minute interviews or focus group sessions comprised of student leaders, faculty and staff, as well as members of the community.

Based on the outcomes of that research, the president's cabinet agreed that a change was needed and that Navigators was the most appropriate choice for the Lee College mascot as it promotes brand attributes associated with exploring new horizons and building a better future.

"We have reimagined our whole student experience and designed each new element to support students and their holistic success," Villanueva added. "The rebranding of our mascot is another feature to highlight the college at the highest level."

# School Supplies: Texas Sales Tax Holiday Aug. 5-7

(AUSTIN) — Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar is reminding shoppers they can save money on clothes and school supplies during the state's sales tax holiday on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 5-7.

State law exempts sales tax on qualified items — such as clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks — priced below \$100, saving shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. The dates of the sales tax holiday and list of tax-exempt items are set by the Texas Legislature.

"Most Texans won't hear the back-to-school bell for another month, but it's never too early to take advantage of the opportunity to save money on everything from book bags to ballpoint pens," Hegar said. "With inflation driving prices higher on just about everything, this sales tax holiday provides Texas families some small relief managing the costs associated with kids heading back to the classroom. As the father of

three school-aged children myself, I know how these expenses can add up."

The Comptroller's office estimates that shoppers will save \$112 million in state and local sales tax during this sales tax holiday

Apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax-free are listed on the Comptroller's website at

TexasTaxHoliday.org.

During the annual sales tax holiday, qualifying items can be purchased tax free online or by telephone, mail, custom order or any other means (including in-store purchases) when either: the item is both delivered to, and paid for by, the customer during the exemption period; or, the customer orders and pays for the item, and the seller accepts the order during the exemption period for immediate shipment, even if delivery is made after the exemption period ends.

Texas' sales tax holiday weekend has been an annual event since 1999.

## Defend Yourself Against Colorectal Cancer

Cancer of the colon or rectum — commonly called colorectal cancer — is the second-leading cause of cancer-related death. "But, if colorectal cancer is detected early, it has a very high survival rate," noted Dr. Samir Nath, a gastroenterologist with the Houston Methodist Gastroenterology Associates at Baytown. "The rate of people being diagnosed with colorectal cancer and death rates for people in the 65-plus age range have been dropping in recent years. However, the number of cases and deaths in younger people is rising." The American Cancer Society estimates that more than 106,000 cases of colon cancer and almost 45.000 cases of rectal cancer will be diagnosed in 2022. Combined, colon and rectum cancer are expected to cause more than 52,000 fa-

## talities in 2022. SCREENING IS VITAL

"For cancers such as colorectal cancer that can be detected by screening, get-

ting tested can be lifesaving," Nath noted. Unfortunately, about 1 in 3 people who should get tested for colorectal cancer have never been screened. "That's troubling because the risk of developing colorectal cancer increases with age," said Nath. "In addition, having a family history of the disease, colorectal polyps or inflammatory bowel disease makes the risk of colorectal cancer significant." Cancer of some other organs may also increase the possibility of colorectal cancer.

## OTHER STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF

The following lifestyle changes can help prevent the disease:

Control weight. Quit smoking.

Limit alcohol to one drink daily for women and two for men.

Exercise Eat low-fat meals rich in

fruits and vegetables.
And don't overlook dietary fiber. Although the medical consensus on fi-

ber's ability to fight col-

orectal cancer has seesawed due to some contradictory findings, the largest study ever undertaken maintains that fiber is indeed a powerful cancer fighter. The 15-year study, ending in 2000, involved nine European countries and 400,000 people. It suggests a high-fiber diet can reduce colorectal cancer risk by 40%

## $40\%. \\ \textbf{HOW IT DEVELOPS}$

Colorectal cancer attacks the large intestine — the long digestive organ that removes solid waste from the body. The major-

ity of colorectal cancers start as polyps. Polyps are visualized as irregularities on the lining of the colon and rectum. Whether a polyp will turn into cancer depends on its type and size. Simply removing them before they become cancerous usually prevents the disease.

### FAMILY TIES

With a blood test, doctors can find genes that cause the two inherited colorectal cancers that so far have been identified, namely:

Familial adenomatous polyposis, a very rare defect marked by hundreds of rectal polyps that appear in the teenage years. Left untreated, cancer develops in nearly every patient by age 45.

Hereditary nonpolyposis colorectal cancer accounts for 10% of colorectal cancer. It's marked by handfuls of polyps. About 80% of flawed gene carri-

## ers develop cancer. SCREENING FOR CANCER

The American Cancer Society recommends one of these screening schedules for most people ages 45 and older (up to age 75):

\*A yearly fecal occult blood test or fecal immunochemical test

\*A stool DNA test as recommended by your doctor \*A sigmoidoscopy every

## Suicide in America

Over the last 20 years, nearly a million Americans have taken their own lives. During that time, suicide has been the tenth leading cause of death for all ages.1 In 2020, it was the second leading cause of death for the ages of 10-14 and 25-34 and the third leading cause for ages 15-24. Because the incidence of suicides is so high among young people, the years of life lost2 is especially tragic. One research group estimated that in 2020 alone, there were nearly a million years of life lost in America to suicide.

The number of suicides over the last two decades has been steadily increasing, reflecting both a larger population and about a third increase in the rate of suicide. Interestingly, suicides topped out at just over 48,000 in 2018, and then declined slightly in 2019 and 2020. Preliminary data for 2021 indicates that there was probably not much change from 2020. This contradicts the predictions of many, including yours truly, that suicides would increase during the pandemic due to depression from isola-

Advocates for stricter gun laws, almost always lump suicides together with homicides and firearm accidents, when citing the toll of gun violence in America. I think that is unhelpful in trying to sort out why so many people die from guns in America because the two phenomena are so dramatically different. However, it is entirely fair to ask the question of whether American's greater access to guns affects the number of suicides.

It seems intuitive that greater access to a lethal weapon would certainly make it easier to commit suicide and therefore more likely. A survey of studies conducted by a research group at Harvard suggests a correlation between the number of gun ownership parameters and higher suicide rates, e.g., people who own handguns are almost ten more likely to commit suicide than non-owners. However, as I have previously discussed, correlation does not necessarily imply causation and some of the data suggests a more complicated picture.

First, only about half of all suicides are committed with a firearm and that rate has remained fairly steady over the last twenty years, despite the rapid increase in gun ownership I noted in my last post. Indeed, the number of suicides committed without a firearm has actually increased by a greater percentage over the last twenty years than firearm suicides (72% vs. 46%).

Also, the United States' suicide rate is only slightly higher when compared to other countries. In 2019, the global rate was about 10.4 versus 11.7 for the U.S., which, of course, does not come close to coinciding with our country's dramatically disproportionate private ownership of firearms compared to other countries.3 And to further muddle the data, there are several countries with miniscule private gun ownership but which have higher suicide rates than the U.S., e.g., Belgium, Russia,

One factor is that individuals who attempt suicide with a firearm more often succeed in ending their life than those who use other methods. A 2000 study found that 82% of those who attempted suicide with a firearm died while less than 10% of those who used other methods did. The study was a relatively small sample and is somewhat dated, but I find those results intuitive and likely consistent with all suicides attempts.

So, does the greater access to firearms in America result in a higher suicide rate? I do not think we can definitively answer that question. But it seems to me that the weight of the evidence suggests the ready access to firearms is a factor that results in a higher rate than we might otherwise have. Does it make a dramatic difference? I doubt it.

## Wildfire Danger Continues to Rise throughout state

As we cross the halfway point of July, wildfire danger continues to increase across the state. On Friday, Texas A&M Forest Service firefighters responded to 15 new wildfires that burned 651 acres. As of Sunday, there were eight active wildfires; the largest was the Nethery Road Fire in Kimble County, involving an estimated 3,500 acres. It has been 70% contained.

The forest service is taking to the air to augment fire suppression efforts on the ground. It has opened the Austin Airtanker Base at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. The service has three dozen aircraft mobilized at 17 airports around the state for wildfire response. The Austin Airtanker Base will serve as a reload station for aircraft coming and going to wildfires. It is the only airport in the state set up for what is known as a Very Large Airtanker, or

can get anywhere in Texas in under one hour. Since being placed in operation in early December, they have flown 4,641 hours and dumped 6.8 million gallons of water and retardant on Texas wildfires.

"This year, we have utilized aviation resources for response in areas experiencing significant wildfire activity," said Jared Karns, with the forest service. "These aircraft provide support to ground crews and assist in protecting homes as well as other critical infrastructure."

There are now 212 counties across the state with burn bans — 84% of the total number of Texas counties.

Fourth consecutive

month with rain deficit Unsurprisingly, June was warmer and drier for much of Texas, according to Dr. Mark Wentzel, hydrologist with the Texas Water Development Board. At the end of June, drought conditions covered

"That all adds up to the conclusion that Texas is in a significant drought, the worst since 2011, but not worse than 2011," Wentzel wrote.

### Forest service aircraft SIX WAYS TO SAVE WATER

TDWB is offering six tips on saving water in a state whose population is expected to increase from 29.5 million in 2021 to 51.1million in 2070 — a 73% increase that will put a strain on water supplies. Water conservation is one of the major strategies recommended in the 2022 state water plan. Here are the tips:

- Water landscape in the early morning and at night when winds are calmer and temperatures
- Design a water-wise landscape with native shrubs, trees and grasses. Native plants have adapted to a region's climate and conserve water more efficiently.
- Follow local watering restrictions. They're there for a reason: to make sure a community doesn't run out of water.
- Manage in-ground irrigation systems and check sprinkler heads. Avoid

#### **TXDOT APPROVES \$146** MILLION FOR STATEWIDE TRANSIT

Transit agencies can use the funds, which come from both federal and state coffers, to cover maintenance costs, buy new buses, build new facilities and expand services to more people, according to Tx-DOT. The funding is a 65% increase over last summer's funds, in large part due to federal funds from the infrastructure act passed last year.

#### O'ROURKE OUTRAISES **ABBOTT IN LAST FOUR MONTHS**

Democratic gubernatorial challenger Beto O'Rourke raised \$27.3 million from Feb. 20 to June 20, outpacing Gov. Gregg Abbott's \$25 million, according to the Austin American-Statesman. Abbott still has a commanding lead in cash on hand, with \$46 million in the bank. The O'Rourke campaign has not released how much cash it has on hand.

The O'Rourke campaign said nearly all its donations were made online, at an average of \$54. Teachers gave more money than people from any other occupation.

The latest poll indicates the race for governor has tightened, though Abbott still holds a 6-point lead — 45% to 39%.

#### **BA.2 VARIANT OF COVID-**19 SPURS HIKE IN CASES

With the highly transmissible BA.2 variant of COVID-19 now the dominant strain, the number of new cases continues to rise in Texas and elsewhere. The Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University reported 107,367 new cases in Texas during the past week, up 27% from the previous week.


Nora is a woman of few words, but I knew what she was saving.



## **Barrett Station MUD50** receives Water **Conservation Grant**

**\$450,000** Awarded for Local Water Conservation Projects to 5 Countywide Projects

Friendswood, Texas -The Harris-Galveston Subsidence District (HGSD) has awarded five local entities a total of \$450,000 in grants to support water conservation projects.

Harris County Municipal Utility District 50 (Barrett Station) will be implementing a shower head replacement project for their residents to improve water efficiency.

The local entities selected to receive this year's water conservation program grant include the City of Friendswood, City of Galveston, and City of Webster, who will install advanced metering infrastructure (AMI) on meters for their water systems. These AMI projects improve meter accuracy and allow water customers to access their data in realtime as well as expedite leak identification and notification for customers with potential leaks. Harris County Freshwater Supply District 1A will utilize grant support for leak detection and water line repair.

joint effort to achieve more efficient use of our water resources so that we can continue to manage the devastating effects of subsidence. Through the support of this grant, they were able to replace traditional irrigation controllers with "smart" weather-based controllers and centralized control systems for over 20 fields resulting in a 26% decrease in their water usage. Klein ISD was recently awarded Texas Energy Managers Association's Project of the Year (2022) for this project's successful impact on water conserva-

Applications for next year's water conservation grant program will be available at the end of May for water utilities, public entities, independent school districts, non-profits, university research programs, or private entities looking to improve water efficiency through irrigation projects in Harris or Galveston counties. 
