## DOJ Targets Colony Ridge in Lawsuit Over Predatory Practices

Baytown Woman Imprisioned After
Embezzling Millions from Her Employer HOUSTON - A $55-$ year-old Baytown woman has been ordered to prison for wire fraud, annou Alamdar S . Hamdani.
Judy M. Green pleaded guilty April 27, admitting to em-
bezzling over $\$ 3$ million from her employer for approximately 10 years.
U.S. District Judge Alfred Bennett has now serve 24 months in federal prison to be immediately followed by three years of supervis e d nett also ordered Green to pay $\$ 3.4$ million in restitution, with $\$ 10,000$ due immediately. At the hearing, the cour heard additional evidence that because of the her theft, he vic lay off employees and could not give bonuses to the remaining employees. In handing down the sentence, the court noted the length and depth of Green's betrayal of people who trusted her.
Green worked as an account manager for a Houston-based building and maintenance supply company. As part of the scheme, she submitted fraudulent invoic-
es to induce payment es to induce paymen
from the company and pocketed the penses. Ultimately, authorities uncovered the scheme when one of the business owners noticed a large payment to an un known credit card company in the summer of 2022. An audit revealed the fraud had been ongoing since 2012

Green was permitted to remain on bond and voluntarily surrender to a U.S. Bureau of Prisons facility to be determined in he near future
The FBI conducted the investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorney Thomas Carter pr
ecuted the case.
